**MINUTES OF THE 7<sup>TH</sup> MEETING OF THE NATIONAL BOARD FOR MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES (NBMSME) HELD ON 7<sup>TH</sup> April 2010 AT VIGYAN BHAVAN, NEW DELHI.**

**(Though the National Board of Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises is meeting for the seventh time, this is the first meeting of the reconstituted National Board for Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (NBMSME))**

The 7<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the National Board for Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (NBMSME) was held on 7<sup>th</sup> April 2010 at Vigyan Bhavan, New Delhi.

The list of the participants is appended.

2. The Additional Secretary & Development Commissioner (MSME) welcomed the Hon'ble Minister of State with Independent Charge (MSME) who is also the Chairman of the National Board for MSME, the Vice Chairman, Members and distinguished invitees of the Board. The proceedings of the meeting started with the opening remarks by the Secretary (MSME). The Secretary (MSME) mentioned that the basic objective of the meeting is to seek inputs from Members of the Board on a number of activities initiated as part of the report of the Prime Minister's Task Force with focus on credit related issues. In this regard, he stated that the Ministry has been coordinating with other Central Ministries and Planning Commission in getting the recommendations of the Prime Minister's Task Force implemented. He mentioned that while it is the responsibility of Reserve Bank of India to ensure credit availability as per the norms prescribed in the report, the Ministry plays an important role in disseminating the information on credit availability to Micro Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs). He expressed his pleasure that the MSME sector is getting adequate attention and support from the Hon'ble Prime Minister and also from other Central Ministries such as M/o Finance and M/o Labour & Employment. Also, he informed that M/o MSME has already initiated various schemes like National Manufacturing Competitiveness Programme (NMCP).

3. In the opening remarks the Hon'ble Minister of State with Independent Charge (MSME) thanked the members of the previous Board and welcomed the members of the newly constituted Board. He mentioned that UPA Government regards MSME sector as central to the growth of economy. The Hon'ble Prime Minister desired that the recommendations of the Task Force be implemented in a time bound manner. The Hon'ble Minister urged that a review of the action taken needs to be done within 6 months on the status of implementation of the recommendations of the task force as desired by the Hon'ble Prime Minister. The Hon'ble Prime Minister, while stressing the contribution of MSME sector to the economy in terms of its contribution to GDP, rate of growth, employment generation and export promotion, admitted that still the actual contribution of the sector is grossly unreported and under reported. Focusing on the meeting's agenda, the Hon'ble Minister stressed on the role of Members of Board in terms of contribution in giving proper feed back for planning and policy formulation. Narrating the areas of concern, he mentioned that the roles of State Government are critical in the fields of accessing land, water, road, electricity and other infrastructure. He mentioned about the special development initiative being launched for KVIC, Coir Board and Work Shed. The Hon'ble Minister desired that the Small Associations need to work together so that the Ministry would be able to constructively engage them since the ministry finds it difficult to interact with nearly 500 associations.

4. Addressing the meeting, Shri Arun Maira, Member, Planning Commission and Vice Chairman of NBMSME mentioned that the mid term appraisal of 11<sup>th</sup> plan recognized the fact that the growth in the industrial sector is less than satisfactory and enough employment is not generated to win the war on poverty and unemployment in the country. The MSMEs in the country needs to be made competitive, he mentioned. While emphasizing the fact that the bottlenecks in MSME sector are well recognized over the past two decades and decisions taken thereof, he reiterated that the implementation of these decisions are not materialized and the need of the hour is to be practical at the ground level.

5. Additional Secretary & Development Commissioner (MSME) presented the Agenda Points based on recommendations of the Prime Minister's Task Force.

6. The representative of Association of Small Industries of the Union Territory of Puducherry stressed upon the need for collateral free loan up to Rs. 5 lakh and also the MSME sector needs to be looked after properly, especially regarding credit related issues. While responding to this issue AS&DC (MSME) mentioned that some of these issues were already taken care of.

7. Shri Manavendra Mukherjee, Hon'ble Minister of Micro, Small Scale Enterprises, Textile & Tourism, Govt. of West Bengal expressed that issues of the MSME sector need to be viewed in a social perspective rather than a mere commercial one. He has welcomed the suggestion for a National Credit Fund. He was also of the opinion that we should be able to define a pre-sickness weak stage of enterprises from where we may revive them. Regarding the proposal for stock exchange for MSMEs, West Bengal Government would be happy to support establishment of the same, he said. Secretary (MSME) responded that any state govt. could partner in this endeavor.

8. Shri K Thakker, representative of Bhartiya Mazdoor Sangh (BMS), stated that there is a need for paradigm shift in our attitude towards MSME sector. Small entrepreneurs need to be supported and assisted accordingly. He mentioned that Efficiency Audit system should be there so that enterprising ability could be rewarded.

9. Shri Oscar Fernandes, Member of Parliament emphasized the importance of marketing and product quality in the development of MSME sector. The cost of production should be brought down considerably so that we would be able to compete with countries like China.

10. Shri Nishkant Mishra, President, Orissa Small Scale Industries Association stressed that implementation of the decisions of the board at ground level is the most important aspect. For this, mind set has to be changed. He urged uniform norms for credit rating by different banks throughout the country.

11. Shri Hansraj G. Ahir, Member of Parliament focused on the need for promoting clusters based on Agro products, bamboo and hard board and also stressed on the issues of power and water shortage. He opined that the cooperation of large industries is vital for growth of the ancillary clusters. He also suggested monitoring of Plant Level Committee meeting for the sake of development of ancillary enterprises.

12. Shri Manicka Tagore, Member of Parliament wanted Central Excise Duty exemption for MSME clusters as he felt that cluster is the answer for almost all problems of the sector.

13. Shri S. Tej Bant Singh Reen, President, Association of Small Scale Industries, Jammu & Kashmir highlighted the issues regarding credit at affordable rate and inspector raj . He wanted to make the provisions and rules of provident fund in J & K at par with other states. He also wanted more procurement of products from J & K by central agencies.

14. Shri Kanam Rajendran of All India Trade Union Congress voiced his concern for ensuring minimum wages and social security in the sector. There should be special programme for skilled development with industry linkages.

15. Ms. Uma Ghurka, President, Confederation of Women Entrepreneurs, Hyderabad appreciated the commitment of Ministry of MSME to the sector. She pointed out the importance of sharing of information on latest developments and technologies for the benefit of the sector. She assigned a pivotal role for

Institutions especially in ensuring adequate flow of credit to the sector. She also drew attention to the problem of delayed payment.

16. Prof. Ravi Shankar Srivastava, Special Invitee, talked about the necessity of Skill Development Centres and labour market information system at the district level. He advocated a dedicated development bank for MSME sector. There should be fixed target for MSME sector out of the priority sector lending and 60% of this credit should be apportioned for Micro Sector.

17. Shri D. Gandhikumar, President, Tamilnadu Small and Tiny Industries Association (TANSTIA), expressed the need for setting up micro industrial estates at district level in every state so that this could be graduated in to small and medium industrial estates. The benefits of linkages could be achieved through the establishment of these industrial estates. He also suggested that the repayment period for term loan from SIDBI should be increased to 10 years.

18. Ms. Shashi Singh, Chairperson, Consortium of Women Entrepreneurs of India (CWEI) threw light on significance of micro credit. She also drew attention to the problem of lack of synergy between centre and states in issues relating to MSMEs. She mentioned about application of information and communication technology for the growth of the sector. Issues related to SC/ST/minority women need to be addressed at the earliest.

19. Shri Badish K Jindal of Federation of Punjab Small Industries Association expressed concern over the issue of inadequate power availability and suggested tax and excise duty exemption for generator sets. In addition, procurement of generator set should be under the coverage of Credit Linked Capital Subsidy Scheme (CLCSS).

20. Shri Pankaj Gupta, President, Industries Association of Uttarakhand advocated a conducive business environment and single window clearance

system for MSME sector. This sector needs to have a proper consultative mechanism for the implementation of Goods and Services Tax (GST). New opportunities are required to be created through innovation.

21. Shri S. S. Rathi, President , Federation of Association of Small Industries of India (FASII) expressed his dissatisfaction on the non-inclusion of delayed payment issue in the Task Force report. According to him, a small amendment in the Income Tax Act can take care of delayed payment issue. Maximum limit of Credit Linked Capital Subsidy Scheme (CLCSS) should be enhanced, keeping in mind the increase in SSI investment limit under MSME Act.

22. Shri P S Agwan of Chamber of Small Industries Association (COSIA) emphasized the importance of skilled development and urged suitable amendments in the current Apprentice Act, which permits only Engineering Graduates/Diploma and ITI holders to get practical training in the factories. The stipend during apprenticeship should be raised. All Industry related Service Business Enterprises should be classified under the head of industries so as to make it more comprehensive.

23. Ms. Jyoti Mackwan, General Secretary, Self Employed Women's Association (SEWA) mentioned the need for promotion of green products and green energy initiatives like solar power.

24. Shri Ashok Sinha, Secretary, Food Processing Industries deliberated the issue of inter ministerial coordination. One ministry alone cannot accomplish infrastructure requirement of MSME sector since there are cross requirement. Apart from this, he mentioned good linkage is necessary between MSME clusters and other clusters like Food Parks.

25. Sh. B.L. Behati of Indian Federation of Tiny Enterprises (IFTE) expressed his concern that no bank is executing mandatory credit provision for Tiny

Enterprises. There should be a Statutory Body to supervise mandatory credit provision upto Rs.5 lakh for Tiny Enterprises without any collateral guarantee and security. He stressed upon establishment of Mini Clusters, Multi Product Clusters and Hat Bazaars at every Districts and Parliamentary constituency throughout the country and also suggested the utilization of M.P. funds for this purpose.

26. Shri Satish Girotra drew attention to the issues of credit and mind set of Field Level Officers of Banks. While complimenting the Secretary (MSME) for his commitment to the sector and RBI for its proactive role on credit related matters, he mentioned things are not so well at the ground level. He advocated a change in attitude of Branch Managers and Field Officers of Banks towards rural and tiny sector. He was of the view that there should not be unnecessary vigilance cases against Branch Managers of Banks who are flexible towards loan beneficiaries from MSE sector.

27. The representative of Confederation of Indian Industries (CII) advocated a common format for credit rating through a consultative mechanism between RBI and IBA. He called for a tax break for large industries, which out source its raw materials and intermediate products from MSE sector.

28. Shri. Ashok Kumar of Federation of Indian Export Organizations requested to bring down the rate of interest of term loan and working capital loan from the present rate to provide the support to MSME sector/Small Exporters. ↻

29. Shri. Subrata Ranjan Roy, President Tripura Industrial Entrepreneurs invited attention to the issues concerning SMEs in North Eastern Region. He wanted MSMEs from North East Region to establish better trade relations with South East Asian Countries.

30. Shri Harish Kedia, President, Chhattisgarh Laghu Evam Sahayak Udyog Sangh asked for updating the websites of Ministry of MSME and Office of the

DC(MSME) on a regular basis to disseminate information to the enterprises. He requested to avoid unnecessary taxes levied by the local bodies on enterprises located in the Industrial Estates.

31. Shri Chandrakant Salunkhe, President Small and Medium Business Chamber of India suggested that agencies like Credit Information Bureau of India Limited (CIBIL) may maintain proper records of those who have repaid the loan on time so that their credit worthiness may be reflected accordingly. He also suggested that the procurement of products from MSMEs by public agencies might be properly displayed on their websites. He wanted the lending rate of interest to SME sector to be not more than 7%. Also, he stressed the importance of setting up SME exchanges.

32. Shri V.K. Sharma, Executive Director, RBI explained that the RBI has given stress to action and outcome orientation with regard to MSME sector. He also informed that there was a year on year growth of 27% in loan disbursement by Public Sector Banks (PSBs) to MSME sector as on March'2009. RBI has organized a meeting of all bank chairmen to assess the shortfall by individual Banks in lending to MSME sector. He was optimistic that the cost of credit for MSME sector would come down once the new base rate system comes into force with effect from 1<sup>st</sup> July, 2010. The RBI has directed all banks to publicize the details of One Time Settlement (OTS) Scheme on their websites.

33. Shri Rajendra Mohan Malla, Chairman-cum-Managing Director (SIDBI) informed the gathering about the success of Credit Guarantee Trust and that more than 1,50,000 loans were already guaranteed upto 31<sup>st</sup> March'2009 under this scheme. A minimum of 5,00,000 new loans were already sanctioned during the current year for Micro and Small sector Enterprises of which 30% were collateral free loans. He also informed, considering the importance of Micro Finance, a total loan amounting to Rs.27, 000 crores has been given to various Micro Credit Institutions.

34. The Hon'ble Minister (MSME) appreciated the overwhelming participation of the Members and offered to consider the suggestions and opinions seriously.

35. The Secretary (MSME) summed up by stating that all the suggestions came up during the discussion would be taken up on priority basis. He appreciated RBI for their speedy action in matters relating to MSME sector. He was of the opinion that the sector would be benefited by the steps taken by RBI. He mentioned that the infrastructure development including provision of land is State Government's domain. Some of the issues relating to raw materials like coal concerning with NSIC may be addressed. Also, he pointed out that labour reforms would be expedited in consultation with concerned Ministries.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the participants.
